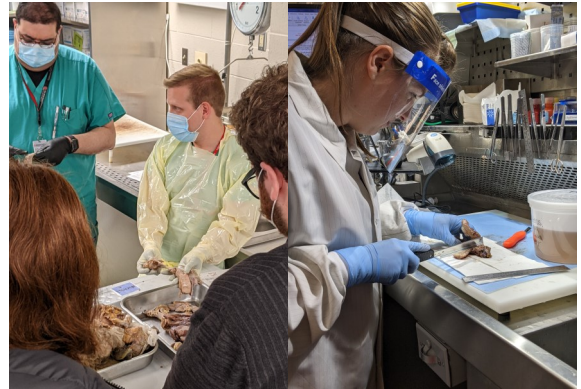


Across the Scope

Outside of Work residents participate in a variety of wellness and social events:

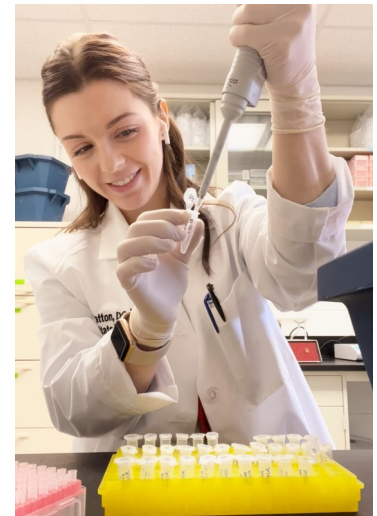
- Lunch at an award-winning local Indian restaurant, followed by team building in escape rooms

- A holiday party organized & hosted by residents, for residents—including OSU Pathology Trivia!



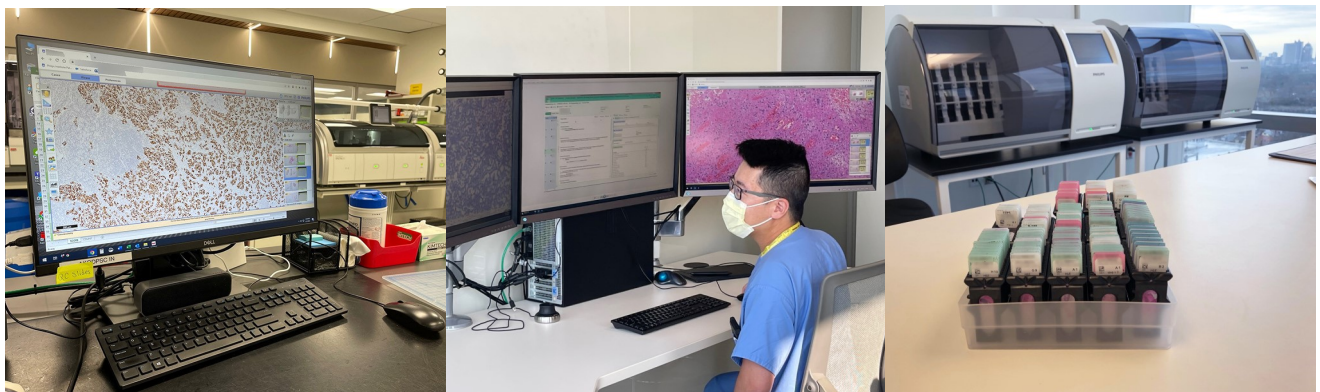
Awards and Achievements

The Future is Now: Beyond the Scope with Digital Pathology



Digital Pathology allows our pathologists to share their knowledge and skills to help patients around the state and across the globe. Daily over 2,400 slides are digitized and made instantly available to our pathologists who use them for primary diagnosis, consultation, education, and research. OSU was the first site in the United States to use digital pathology for primary diagnosis, and we manage one of the world’s largest collections of whole slide images. We are also a leader in deploying quantitative image analysis, machine learning, and artificial intelligence to produce diagnoses for patients that are dramatically faster, more comprehensive, and more accurate than previously possible.
